Sixteen months on and the effects of the Beirut explosion coupled with an unprecedented economic collapse are taking a heavier toll on the families of the victims and the people of Beirut as questions remain unanswered and justice is yet to prevail.

We, at Together LiBeirut, have exercised every effort to help alleviate the pain and give hope to survivors and Lebanese living locally and abroad as we aim to rebuild our country on solid foundations.

Together with our three implementing partner NGOs, Lebanon Needs, Cénacle de la Lumière and The House of Christmas, we worked to facilitate access to healthcare and mental health services to the most vulnerable, advance heritage restoration, restore livelihoods by empowering small businesses and preserving the social fabric of our neighborhoods. Working together has helped us deliver a significantly greater impact: our synergies have enabled us to reach 22,145 beneficiaries to date.

As we continue our journey towards the recovery of Beirut and its people, we stand firm by our commitment to serving and acting for the interest of our country and by our belief that together we will contribute to the rebirth of Lebanon; a cohesive nation where dignity, stability, justice, and opportunities prevail for all Lebanese.

RECOVERY

Following the devastating explosion of the port of Beirut on August 4, 2020, young Lebanese from across the globe joined forces with local NGOs to launch Together LiBeirut, an emergency relief campaign dedicated to a sustainable recovery of Lebanon's capital.

COLLABORATION

Our collaborative approach is led by experts in four sectors: healthcare, mental health, livelihood, and heritage preservation. With our three implementing partner NGOs Lebanon Needs, Cénacle De La Lumière, and The House of Christmas, we have pooled our expertise and resources to achieve a greater impact and long-lasting results.

SUSTAINABILITY

Our campaign seeks to help deliver tangible results through the implementation of sustainable solutions. Together LiBeirut's multi-year recovery plan aims to achieve the following objectives:

- Building social security through promoting free access to healthcare and psycho-social support services;
- Protecting livelihoods through rehabilitating and supporting micro and small businesses and;
- Devising an integrated approach to urban rehabilitation and heritage preservation.

NEIGHBORHOOD APPROACH

Entire neighborhoods have been decimated by the blast, destroying their infrastructure, housing, heritage buildings, economic activity, and social fabric. Together LiBeirut focuses its multi-sectorial interventions in the neighborhoods of Gemmayzeh, Mar Mikhael, and Bourj Hammoud to support the various facets of the neighborhoods and maximise impact.

BUDGET ALLOCATED PER SECTOR



BUDGET DISTRIBUTION PER SECTOR










SUPPORTING MEDICAL INFRASTRUCTURE AND PROMOTING HEALTHCARE ACCESS FOR VULNERABLE PATIENTS

The healthcare infrastructure was severely damaged after the blast and required immediate response. Our partner Lebanon Needs promptly supported the most affected yet underserved healthcare institutions in Beirut, assisting them with infrastructure rehabilitation, equipment repairs, and supplies provision. They also increased support to the uninsured patients and vulnerable survivors across the city through the provision of critical medication and medical assistance.

REHABILITATING HEALTHCARE INSTITUTIONS

KARANTINA HOSPITAL



The Karantina Hospital is one of the few public hospitals in Lebanon that cater to vulnerable patients. It is one of the hardest-hit by the Beirut explosion. The reconstruction work led by our partner Lebanon Needs



focused on the hospital's critical infrastructure, including: doors, windows, corridors, cafeteria, washrooms and the Pharmacy and IT Departments.



ROSARY SISTERS HOSPITAL

The rehabilitation of the fourth floor of the Rosaire Hospital is underway. The floor is being repurposed to serve patients requiring isolation, such as those suffering from COVID-19 and other infectious diseases. The rehabilitation work is estimated to be completed in February 2022.

GEITAOUI LEBANESE HOSPITAL

One of the largest medical centers in Beirut, Geitaoui Hospital was severely affected by the explosion. Reconstruction work included: doors, windows, electricity, ventilation, alarm systems, and the dormitories of healthcare workers.





NABAA PRIMARY HEALTHCARE CENTER

Nabaa primary healthcare center provides care for 1,700+ vulnerable patients annually. The reconstruction work included: waterproofing, painting, and door repairs.



The damaged electronic system of the MRI machine was replaced to help assess the health of over 270 patients monthly.


CHRONIC MEDICATIONS DISTRIBUTION

A medication distribution network was developed with 5 pharmacies to provide monthly medications to 611 vulnerable patients.

Together LiBeirut supported Lebanon Needs as it partnered with local initiatives Ahla Fawda, AUB Khaddit Beirut, Baytna Baytak, and Shaabi Mas2ouliyat to launch the "Stronger Together Lebanon" campaign, which formed COVID-19 task forces across Lebanon to help COVID-19 patients at home and in hospitals. The campaign also helped equip hospitals and municipalities with life-saving equipment and supplies.

MINIMIZING THE RISK OF POST-TRAUMATIC DISORDERS, PROVIDING **ACCESS TO FREE MENTAL** HEALTH TREATMENT, AND SUPPORTING THE LONG TERM WELL-BEING OF CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILIES

Caring for the physical and mental health of our community is at the heart of what we do. With Cénacle de La Lumière (CDLL) we are providing comprehensive, free of charge support to children, youth, and families. In close collaboration with neighbouring schools and institutions, CDLL offers awareness activities, life skill sessions, and mental health treatment to help members of the community overcome psycho-social challenges and build mental resilience.

The" Youth Cap" Center in Mar Mikhael was launched in partnership with Saint Joseph University's Health and Mental Health Departments and Hotel Dieu de France's Psychiatric Department.

The center gathers leading doctors and experts to support the health and well-being of affected individuals and help them manage long-term recovery with a special focus on children and youth.





REVITALIZING THE SOCIO-ECONOMIC FABRIC OF THE MAIN URBAN STRIP LINKING GEMMAYZEH, MAR MIKHAEL, AND BOURJ HAMMOUD

Microbusinesses are the soul of every neighborhood and represent the largest portion of the local economy. The August 4 explosion has decimated many small businesses that have served their people for generations. With The House of Christmas, 106 microbusinesses were selected across the main strip linking the three neighborhoods of Gemmayzeh,



Mar Mikhael, and Bourj Hammoud. These businesses were provided with comprehensive and strategic support, including: rehabilitation, capacity building, repositioning, branding, supply chain optimization, as well as financial and legal support.






RESTORING HOMES, PRESERVING DIGNITIES

As we seek to preserve the dignity of families affected by the explosion, we have rehabilitated 54 homes in the affected areas*:

HERITAGE INTERVENTION



REHABILITATING OUR HERITAGE, PROTECTING OLD TENANCIES, AND PRESERVING OUR IDENTITY

The port explosion has hit the heart of Beirut's historical neighborhoods and destroyed landmark heritage buildings dating back to as early as the 1850's, most of which are occupied by tenants and families who have been residing in them for decades.

Led by The House of Christmas, a team of specialists in the heritage and culture recovery sector came together to:



- Raise awareness on the need to restore, preserve, and protect the heritage buildings that were damaged by the blast;
- Undertake the reconstruction and renovation of identified atrisk buildings;
- Protect the tenancy of vulnerable families, and;
- Restore the social fabric and economic activity of historical neighborhoods.






The Tamish building dates back to the 1920s and was the first fully rehabilitated building in Mar Mikhael following the blast. It houses 8 families, 6 micro-businesses, and 50 direct beneficiaries.






A 1900s building, Rif is one of the first fully rehabilitated building in Gemmayzeh. It houses 9 families, 5 micro-businesses, and 30 direct beneficiaries.





Our heritage intervention took a cluster-focused approach targeting a collection of buildings rather than just individual buildings. The first selected cluster, the Gholam Cluster, comprises 5 heavily damaged heritage buildings, dating back to the 19th and 20th centuries, on rue Gouraud in Gemmayzeh housing 7 families, 11 businesses, and 54 direct beneficiaries.

This project is in collaboration with the Beirut Heritage Initiative who are rehabilitating one building as well as the Gholam stairs while The House of Christmas rehabilitated three buildings and propped up one.









Our legal framework underpins our commitment to good governance, long-lasting results, and protection of the most vulnerable. Our legal partner, Tohme Law Firm, advises us on our day-today interventions, including contractual relationships and regulatory issues related to the four areas of intervention. Additionally, we work closely with Tohme Law Firm to provide legal support and protection to the beneficiaries across sectors including business owners and tenants.






COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

SUNDAY LIBEIRUT October 25, 2020

"Sunday LiBeirut" took expats on an 18-hour livestream virtual tour of Beirut on Sunday October 25, 2020. The aim of "Sunday LiBeirut" was to reconnect with the global Lebanese community and remind them of the importance to rebuild our beloved city, and hope in a more sustainable tomorrow. The tour was broadcasted on Together LiBeirut's Instagram channel from 6am to midnight, capturing the characteristic soul of the city through discussions and chats with business owners, artists, and residents alike. These included designers Nada Ghazal and Hoda Baroudi, mountaineer Rami Rasamny, activist Hiba Dandashli, leading architect Habib Debs and Michel the iconic hairdresser of Mar Mikhael amongst many others Beirut lovers.



CHRISTMAS AT TAMISH

December 25, 2020

On Christmas day we invited the global community to join us through live stream for a movie projection on Tamish, the first heritage building that was fully rehabilitated by our partner HOC. The movie was a collection of old footages about Christmas in Lebanon. This event restored a sense of community during this time of the year and brought warmth and hope to the street of Mar Mikhael.



THE 19.8 BEIRUT SPORT CHALLENGE

June 12-14, 2021

The 19.8 Beirut Global Sports Challenge mobilized Lebanon lovers worldwide. The challenge's name is inspired by the area size of Beirut, which is 19.8km2, and invited all people to raise awareness and funds for Beirut's ongoing rehabilitation. We held this challenge to remind the world of Beirut's manifold humanitarian needs ten months after the devastating August 4 explosion, and to garner worldwide support for the thousands of survivors who remain in the city. Participants included athletes, celebrities, amateurs across age groups and from all parts of the world. More than 220 people took the challenge and raised a total of \$113,621 and LBP 31,637,000.



A MUSICAL TRIBUTE August 3, 2021

On the eve of the first August 4th commemoration, we gathered as one community on the stairs of St Nicolas to remember the 220+ friends, family members, and colleagues we lost. The musical tribute brought together 12 musicians/ singers who performed a repertoire of traditional Lebanese songs that captured our community's mourning, heartache, and hope. The event was live-streamed on Together LiBeirut's social media channels and viewed by more than 4,400 people.
